

- a) **Park/ toilets** — It was agreed by the meeting that J. Morphet’s charge for cleaning the public toilets should be confirmed at a 3% increase as had been initially proposed at the previous meeting. The Clerk reported that the replacement netting for the play area had been sent, but was the wrong size so she was awaiting for the delivery of a replacement.
- b) **The Brow** – An acknowledgement had been received for the planning application submitted by the Clerk for the Corsican Pine. The Clerk had received a request from a resident of the Bottoms regarding a conifer outside her house who had asked for its removal. It was confirmed by the members that the first priority was to remove the Corsican Pine, and other trees would come under consideration next year.
- c) **Street Cleaning and Highway Faults** - Cllr. Weaire commented that the pothole on Main Street had been patched, although the one near Mealbank Hall had not been repaired.
- d) **Street Lighting** – Street lights were reported out by Hillside Garage and Brown & Whittakers and the Clerk undertook to report these matters. Cllr. Weaire stated that there should be a schedule of lights submitted to Howsons every month with a note of the faulty street lights. Cllr. Lis confirmed that the street light near Brookacre was still not working and the Clerk undertook to report these matters.
- e) **Middle School** – Cllr Weaire read to the meeting a list of his suggestions for the site. There is a public meeting to be held on Tuesday night to discuss the future use of the building.
- f) **Mobile Phone Coverage** An acknowledgement had been received from Julian Smith MP. It was agreed that this matter should remain on the Agenda.
- g) **Provision of teenage leisure facilities** – Cllr. Lis reported on the project to the members, the Clerk was engaged in requesting funding application forms for the bike track. Cllr. Weaire raised the matter of Mealbank Hall as he had received concerns about the signage and lighting.
- h) **Allotments/Yorkshire in Bloom** – Cllr. King Sparke reported that Ingleton had received a silver medal at the recent Yorkshire in Bloom awards, with the Wheatsheaf achieving a bronze medal. It had been agreed by the group not to enter next year.
- i) **Community Centre** – Next meeting of the Joint Management Committee meeting was on Monday 10 October.
- j) **Hydro Project** – Cllr. Metcalfe reported on a recent meeting with Craig Wilson (CDC) and Andrea Burnett (YDPA) and it had been agreed that the level of investment required for this project meant that it was likely to be taken further by a third party interested in completing this project. This was accepted by the meeting.
